












A DREAM COMES TRUE

A WORD IN BRUCE ESPLIN'S EAR

In my role as editor of Blackwood News, I attended the Community Newspaper Association of Victoria 2009 conference (cnav.org.au). Held in Toolangi, near Kinglake, the focus of the conference was 'Strengthening Communities in Times of Crisis'.

The conference was opened by Jacinta Allan MP, Minister for Regional & Rural Development, who spoke about the role her department has played in the aftermath of Black Saturday fires & the importance of locally delivered information delivered by credible locals.

Karen Kissane, senior writer for the Age, was the keynote speaker. She spoke about her experiences while covering Kinglake in the days immediately after the fires. She is now covering the Royal Commission.

The Emergency Services Commissioner, Bruce Esplin, reinforced the value of community newspapers in aiding the dissimination of emergency information. One of his main points concerned the trust that communities have in information provided by their own members. He spoke of the Emergency Services plans to use community newletters/papers as one of their means of communication through an email system.

As Blackwood News is a bi-monthly publication, one of the things that particularly concerned me during the February fires in Daylesford was the difficulty in getting out information between issues. Up until now, Blackwood News has not had the means to provide current, accurate & validated information immediately.

Come in TWITTER. Any releases relevant to Blackwood which we receive from Emergency Services will be put straight from releaseson our twitter TWITTER site http://twitter.com/ blackwoodvic which I have set up specifically for this purpose. We will also 'tweet' upcoming happenings in & around Blackwood.

For those who are not familiar with TWITTER it is really very easy to use. Simply click on the link from blackwoodnews.com.au or type http://twitter.com/blackwoodvic into your browser address bar. Most recent messages (no more that 140 characters in length) are listed first..

In order to 'follow' Blackwood News 'tweets' you will need to signup for your own twitter page – a quick & easy process & little private information is required. Another idea is to link to RSS "Really Simple Syndication" feeds. RSS feeds bring automatically updated information straight to your desktop. To understand more about RSS see a great video at http://www.commoncraft.com/rss_plain_english which explains it. Twitter can also be accessed from most mobile handsets.

So have a look, add yourself as a follower & we'll do our best to circulate reliable information as it comes to us.



OUR UNIQUE & WONDERFUL WILDLIFE

The heart of my passion! Here in Australia, we are very lucky to be gifted with some of the most unique, colourful & calm wildlife in the world. Many species of soft footed, soft to touch & soft natured animals in the world. Apart from Dingoes (not so common in the south anyhow), none of our wildlife kill chickens or attack the family pet, yet so many people living in such a beautiful environment consider some species to be a pest?! In fact, looking at it in terms of sustainability, we Humans are the pests!

Since our settlement on this large land over 220 years ago, with rapid evolvement of population & technology, we have made extinct 54 species of native wildlife. That's an average of one species every 4 years!! GONE.....FOREVER!! Our Koalas, among other species, are facing rapid declines in numbers for various reasons; road kill, pet dog attacks, land clearing for urbanisation & diseases brought on by living under such stressful conditions. Not only this, but our wildlife are trying to survive through what Mother Nature serves up, bushfires, floods, drought. This robs them of food, habitat, water, social structures & even more sadly for thousands - their lives.

We have an amazing array of wildlife through the Wombat State Forest; let's give them a break. We have built roads & homes through their territories, among their homes. From Dusk

to Dawn is when the most movement occurs, as most of our wildlife, bar a lot of bird species are nocturnal. Pretty smart when you consider our weather conditions. As an ex-driving instructor I ask you to remember the speed limit is just that; a limit! The speed limit being reduced from 100 to 80kmph along the Greendale-Trentham road was a good start, but it is still too fast from dusk til dawn. To all those who travel around 60kmph during these times are to be commended!

The first thing we (instructors) teach the young is to drive according to the environment & conditions at the time. An example is slowing down in urban areas where there are lots of children. Why is this any different when driving through the bush? We can't teach the wildlife "Look to the left...look to the right...look to the left again...Then when the road is clear of traffic..."

As a wildlife rescuer, I have seen first hand the massacre of man against machine & remind everyone that the law states that if you are involved in a collision you are required to stop. This includes a collision with an animal! It is only respectful that if you hit any living being you stop to see if it needs any medical attention or if needs to be put down to end it's pain & suffering.

So, with our furry friends in mind, I wish you all a festive & fire free period. Safe journeys if you are making one.



is synonymous with our summers. With any fire hazard, prevention should be a first choice. The type & amount of vegetation surrounding a property, together with other combustibles, ie firewood, needs to be considered & firebreaks are one of many options available. But as we saw in February, bushfire can be an unknown quantity & the prevailing weather conditions, high winds & high temperatures, may result in bushfire threat that overrides the prevention measures.

Fire protection takes two broad forms. Active systems comprise the application of water, generally, by either manual or automatic means. Manual application can be by either the fire brigade's or property owner's during the bushfire, but there is a certain degree of risk associated to people untrained in fighting fires. Automatic means can be by water sprinklers or sprayers & although there is a range of systems in use, there are currently no Standards covering these for bushfire application.

The second form is the application of passive systems & this involves design & construction of buildings located in bushfire-prone areas. Australian Standard AS 3959 Construction of buildings in


In Blackwood the threat of bushfire bushfire-prone areas, has been under development for some 22 years & is intended to prevent the entry of burning embers from entering a building or accumulating in such a way that would promote ignition. The Standard also addresses heat that radiates from the bushfire &, in recent stages of development, now goes further in an attempt to offer fire resistance to building elements (walls, roofs, windows, doors etc) from direct flame contact.

The current Australian Standard AS 3959 is intended to afford the occupants a degree of safety until the bushfire front passes. In so doing, there is also a component of property protection built in to the Standard. However, the Standard carries a warning to the effect that there can be no guarantees that a building will survive a bushfire event on every occasion due to the unpredictable nature & behaviour of fire & the difficulties associated with extreme weather conditions. In preparing for the upcoming fire season ask yourself what will burn? &, more importantly, what won't? 




